Annex 1: Reporting guide and structure

I. Step by Step Reporting Organization:

- 1. We meet at 13h on Thursday at room Lausanne (https://bbb.ch-open.ch/b/tob-lxf-ppk-8sa) after the voting session to update the working schedule if necessary. Languages to identify after the voting session. We will also update the working schedule according to the topics / reporters' interests
- 2. You create beforehand your individual framapad or a document in your local computer to take notes 2.1.1.1. Check the general report structure below
- 3. You send to the coordinator at the end of every panel your report (this will be a preliminary version to provide a collective summary of the discussions, it doesn't have to be perfect at this point)
- 4. The coordinator gathers together all the reports and provides the general summary to the editing committee
- 5. There is a virtual room [https://bbb.ch-open.ch/b/tob-lvi-fby-xz3] for the reporters as well as the Slack channel so we help each other
- 6. One week after the unconference, you need to send the coordinator your final report updated/improved with the recordings and collective notes. Recordings might not be possible if participants do not agree on recording the session, take notes properly just in case.

II. Report General Structure:

Take notes freely about the discussions in your panels and answer the questions below (as much as possible). Try to keep these questions in mind for taking notes but you are not requested to strictly follow this structure as the discussions can take different forms. You are mainly requested to present the discussion as it is taking form. The main structure of the discussion should be that one of the spontaneous organization lead by the participants' interactions.

What is the core topic of the session?

Present the discussion leader (if there is any, name, affiliation, discipline)
How many participants were present?

What were the main arguments in the discussion?



Why this is an issue in DH?

Main challenges addressed by participants

Recurrent suggestions / initiatives

Agreements: e.g. consensus on methodological problem

Disagreements: e.g. funding or epistemology

Future potential research

Ask participants to share their writings if they are experts in the domain and they were actively participating in the discussion.

No length required. Do not enter too much into the details (unless you consider it necessary) as it is time consuming, and this can make more difficult the collective summaries.

Write the report in the discussion language, if there are too many languages and switching is difficult use your preferred language. We will help each other if you need to correct some languages after the panels end.
